Note to World - Western Canada is open and ready for business

April 26, 2007, Airdrie, AB: - "As western Canadian farmers ramp up barley production maltsters should take advantage of the increased supply" says Jeff Nielsen, President of the Western Barley Growers Association (WBGA), on the eve of the first barley market forum. "Domestic maltsters and grain companies looking for export supplies will have access to the largest malt supply in the world and farmers will have price discovery and price arbitrage with higher US and world prices for the first time. It's a great time to be a barley grower," comments Nielsen, "that is something that has not been said for a long, long time."

Malt barley is a premium niche market. Reliable supply of a consistent high quality product is critical to a malt company. Western Canada is the place to be for malt companies. "While the rest of the world is struggling with supply or quality problems, western Canadian maltsters typically rejected three quarters of the Canadian malt samples" states Nielsen. "That's a luxury most malt companies in the rest of the world envy."
